Content

This workshop is a hands-on introduction to the quantitative analysis of linguistic data. It is geared primarily towards linguists with little or no experience in analysing quantitative data. We will use the software package R.

The general sessions will be conducted in English.

Part 1 (9th of May):

During the first part, the nuts and bolts of statistical analysis will be introduced. Topics to be covered include:

- exploratory data analysis using graphics and descriptive statistics
- goals and logic of inferential (frequentist) statistics
- an introduction to R (open-source statistical software)
- basic analytical tools and tests in R
- peculiarities of linguistic data (e.g. the 'language-as-fixed-effect' fallacy)

Depending on the datasets to be analysed in the second part and requests from the participants, more advanced tools can be introduced as well.

Part 2 (22nd and 23rd of May):

During the second part, we will take a closer look at the participants' own datasets in individual sessions. Issues that arise during these individual sessions and are deemed to be of general importance will be taken up again in plenary sessions.
